
Rural Cemeteries in the American Midwest

- Family plots & church graveyards





- Gender/Age
 - Men's gravestones more ornate/expensive than women's and children's?

 - Ages, year of birth, names, etc.
- Demographic analyses
 - Foster and Hummel (1995)
- Gender/Age
 - Relationship status inscriptions ("Daughter of...", etc.)
 - Qualitative data categories





Results


- N = 115




Deaths by Decade

 - Collect data from neighboring cemeteries


